

How wonderful it is to introduce our final word for the year and how important and delightful that word is— **HOSPITALITY**. I am sure the first mention of the word brings to mind gatherings, serving drinks and eats, and happy participants who are mingling and enjoying the company and pleasantness of the environs! It could be a **Hospitality** Tent where similar things are taking place. (Perhaps a good ole tailgate!) The Gospel experience which may include the above, certainly goes much deeper than that. Now think about all the many powerful words and experiences that come from that single root word:

Hospital: Hospitalist Hospitable Hospice Hostel and then the opposite end of the spectrum: **Hostile**

Shortly after he was called to be our Holy Father, Pope Francis granted an interview with his confreres, The Jesuits, and over three private meetings the Holy Father laid out much of what was going to be really important during his Papacy. It could easily be identified as an integral part of his **Mission Statement**. Here is some of what he had to say:

"I see clearly that the thing the Church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful; it needs nearness, proximity. I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds....and you have to start from the ground up.

"The Church sometimes has locked itself up in small things, in small-minded rules. The most important thing is the first proclamation: Jesus Christ has saved you. And the ministers of the church must be ministers of mercy above all. The confessor, for example, is always in danger of being either too much of a rigorist or too lax. Neither is merciful, because neither of them really takes responsibility for the person. The rigorist washes his hands so that he leaves it to the commandment. The loose minister washes his hands by simply saying, 'This is not a sin' or something like that. In pastoral ministry we must accompany people, and we must heal their wounds."

Pope Francis further said, "Let us try also to be a Church that finds new roads, that is able to step outside itself." How beautiful is that?!

As we begin another Liturgical Year, I am delighted to extend HOSPITALITY to our newest staff member Rev. John Mc Gregor (Deacon). I invite you to extend that same Hospitality to him as he joins our team. We have been praying and discerning this process over the past four years and now, at last, it is coming to fruition. John has been working along with our staff as a consultant and guide over the past two years. We are delighted to welcome him to our team. As our new St. Paul Parish administrator, John will be a wonderful leader and guide as we move into new stages of growth and development. We have wonderful plans and opportunities in place which will be shared with all of you as we move along! We will experience significant growth in our movement from Maintenance to Mission! Our goal is going to be centered on making Missionary Disciples which is fundamentally why any parish community exists.
