# You will be ENRICHED!

This week I spent a great deal of time pouring over the year-end financial statements and I realized how important it is to take the time to be careful and attentive to this aspect of my responsibility. I know from experience that this is a very important part of my work as Pastor-- "being a good steward of all that is entrusted to us" and keeping appropriate and accurate accounting of what people have provided us for the building up of the Kingdom.

I am always amazed in going through the statements by the broad range of information that it provides. Some people are really devoted to every collection that is taken up in church. Others are devoted to the weekly parish collections--still others to the diocesan, or global collections. Some contribute consistently, others sporadically. Some contribute very generously, others very sparingly. Some wish to be identified while others do not. Some appear to have a genuine understanding of the great grace/gift of Generosity, others don't have that.

What is it that moves or motivates one to be very generous and another to be not so generous, and yet another to be totally selfish? Is it experience? Is it upbringing? Conditioning? Is it global influence, familial influence, or cultural or community influence? Or is it just plain fear/love? I sometimes think of it as a continuum.

> Fear-----x-----x------x----------------Love (where am I on this continuum?)

To the extent that Fear controls my life, I tend to be selfish. To the extent that Love controls my life, I tend to be Generous. What do you think? How does one learn to be generous? Is Generosity a learned virtue, or is it in innate? What do you think?

Let's have a discussion about it. <u>Please send me your perspectives and let's begin a sharing through the bulletin</u>.

We live in a world that is profoundly influenced by GREED, GREED, and more GREED! How well is that objective serving us?

Dr. Karl Menninger once asked a very wealthy patient, "What are you going to do with all of that money?" The patient replied, "Just worry about it I guess." "In that case," said Dr. Menninger, "Do you experience much pleasure out of worrying about your money?" With a heavy sigh, the patient replied, "No, but I feel such terror when I think of giving any of it away." Commenting on his patient's money-sickness, Dr. Menninger said, "Generous people are rarely mentally ill."

I read that and said WOW! Is that really true? Why?

St. Paul has a delightful reflection in his second letter to the Corinthians:

"The one who provides *seed for the sower and bread for food* will provide you with all the seed you want and make *the harvest of your good deeds* a larger one, and made richer in every way, <u>you will be able</u> to do all the generous things which, through us, are the cause of thanksgiving to God." (2 Corinthians 9: 10-11)
