We Are Missionary Disciples

The other day I was reading Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*. In it he speaks directly to the responsibility of every baptized person to carry out the essential mission of the Church:

The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized. Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples" (120).

Like Peter in today's Gospel, we may want to remain on the mountain top with Jesus, just basking in His glory; after all, *maintenance* is a lot easier than *mission*. Because Jesus did not want His mission to get derailed prematurely, He warns the disciples, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." It is clear that He gave them this vision so that they might share it with others, and those others might come to know who Jesus is through their experience.

I believe it is the same with us. Jesus has revealed Himself to each of us, not for ourselves alone, but so that we might share Jesus with others. This is the essential mission of the Church. This is the essential duty of every baptized Christian. This is what it means to be missionary disciples. This is what ChristLife is all about. This is what it means to move from Maintenance to Mission.

Dear Parishioners,

The Finance Committee met for a mid-fiscal year budget review as of December 31, 2016. We are happy to report that for the first 6 months of this budget year (July $1 - Dec. 31^{st}$), the total income is ahead of budget projections by 7% and overall expenses are lower that projections by 4%. Variances within the expenses are as follows: Facilities Total - expected maintenance expenses not expended. Diocesan Assessments – increase generated from the Diocesan budget. General & Admin. – delay in hiring Church Administrator.

Building expansion plans have been placed on hold in order to focus on building up the kingdom from within our current walls through Christ Life Programs. We continue to build cash reserve for our future expansion plans.

We are available to answer any specific questions you may have. We will have a verbal and more detailed report this fall after we close our fiscal year end (June 30, 2017).
