While it is so very important in our own Church Community here at St. Paul, we have in these past few days been reminded of how important it is in our country. The Presidential Election has raised all sorts of questions regarding leadership of our country. The election (selection of a new president) has most assuredly pushed many buttons and has unveiled a huge measure of discontent among those being led.

What a nice time it would be to step back from the whole process and cool our engines a little before proceeding!

For us Catholics, we are approaching the end of the Liturgical Year. The year ends with us appropriately celebrating "Our Lord Jesus Christ, Christ the King of the Universe" or as we more commonly call it, The Feast of Christ the King. How appropriate is that! We come to the end of the year and celebrate once again who the real leader is, just in case we may have forgotten during that long liturgical season of Ordinary Time.

The final Sunday before Christ the King usually addresses the end times, the end of life, the end of the world. This Sunday's gospel very appropriately addresses these things. *Then, they asked him, "Teacher, when will these things happen?" (Luke 21:7)* Jesus didn't hold anything back from his disciples and those listening on this occasion. He told them things would be real difficult. He spoke about earthquakes, wars and revolutions, plagues and famines, persecutions and imprisonments, betrayal, hatred, and killings! In truth, this is such an important part of the Gospel. Jesus laid all of these things out for His followers. What He has to say next is the most important part of His teaching. He let His followers know that such happenings would provide them a powerful opportunity to bear witness to Him and to the Gospel.

It is in times of darkness that people most need the Light. It is in times of falsehood that the Truth is most needed. It is in times of war that **Peace** is most needed. It is in times of hatred that Love is most needed.

It is in the face of the most difficult times that a true Christian witness is needed and appreciated. It would be so easy to fall into the trap of arguing and complaining, but what the



Master says is so powerful "...for I myself will give you a wisdom in speaking that all of your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute."

Wisdom-- one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit! What a great time to be renewed in that gift-- that **HOLY SPIRIT**!




We now have a Nursery at 10:30 mass for ages infant to 2 years old in the creeper room. Enter through the Early Learning Center kitchen.
