Here is a great story:

THE HOSPITAL WINDOW

The man in the other bed began to live for those one-hour periods where his world would be broadened and enlivened by all the activity and *color of the world* outside. Young lovers walked arm-in-arm amidst flowers of every color and a fine view of the city skyline could be seen in the distance. As the man by the window described all this exquisite detail, the man on the other side of the room would close his eyes and imagine the picturesque scene.

One warm afternoon the man by the window described a parade passing by. Although the other man couldn't hear the band--- he could see it in his mind's eye, as the gentleman by the window portrayed it with descriptive words.

One morning, the day nurse arrived to bring water for their baths, only to find the lifeless body of the man by the window, who had died peacefully in his sleep. She was saddened and called the hospital attendants to take the body away. As soon as it seemed appropriate, the other man asked if he could be moved next to the window. The nurse was happy to make the switch, and after making sure he was comfortable, she left him alone. Slowly, painfully, he propped himself up on one elbow to take his first real look at the real world. He strained to slowly turn to look out the window beside the bed.
