In today's gospel, Jesus performs the second of seven miracles in the Gospel of John. He returns to Cana, where He had turned the water into wine. There, He encounters an official whose son is very ill. Fearing his son would die, the man begs the Lord to return with him and heal his son. Jesus tells him to go and assures him that his son will live.

Jesus remarks, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe."
