# following CHRIST a seven-week experience

As a living part of the Body of Christ, our prayers matter — yours and mine! Jesus promised Peter, "Upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail." — MT 16:18. You and I are part of that promise when we draw ourselves into Him, when we make ourselves ACCESSIBLE to our Lord. We are His Church!

Prayer is an essential part of our Christian living. When we pray, we are in communion with Our Lord. Prayer transforms us, blesses our Parish, and changes the world! In our Discovering Christ Sessions we learned that Prayer and Scripture are key elements to growing in the life of the Holy Spirit. Our prayer time is time devoted to the most important relationship in our lives — relationship with Jesus Christ. Fr. Henry Shelton gave us more tools and insight to develop that relationship when he led our parish mission last year.

Pages 16-19 of the Mission booklet How Accessible am I to God? included this meditation:

#### **READ 1JOHN 4**

"We have come to know and believe in the love God has for us.... We for our part love because He first loved us."

#### REFLECTION

DUR PRAYERS MATTER

- Jesus has said to you, "I want to love you."
- What feelings does this surface in you?
- What questions does this raise for you?
- What challenges does this present for you?
- What rewards would/does this relationship offer you?
- What other issues do you see in this relationship?

Fr. Shelton recommends spending regular quiet time reflecting on these questions and developing our openness to being ACCESSIBLE to God. What does being ACCESSIBLE to God feel like in my own life? Fr. Shelton suggests we spend some time just holding our feelings before our Lord. He says, "Simply let yourself be an observer of what surfaces in you. Try not to control the experience or judge what surfaces in you."

Let us pray that we each make the following prayer our own:

Prayer of Abandonment by Blessed Father Charles de Foucault Father, I abandon myself into Your hands; do with me what You will. Whatever You may do I thank You. I am ready for all, I accept all. Let only Your will be done in me, and in all Your creatures; I wish no more than this, O Lord. Into Your hands I commend my soul. I offer it to You with all the love of my heart; for I love You, Lord, and so need to give myself, to surrender myself into Your hands without reserve, and with boundless confidence, for You are my Father. Amen.


