EXAMINATION OF CONSCIOUSNESS

When we give too much attention to our own victories and failures, we can easily develop a sense of self-absorption, which supports our illusion that we are the managers of our own lives.

An Examination of Consciousness is much more a question of —
How I am responding to God's loving action in my life?

How am I inviting Him to be a part of my whole day, not just my morning and evening?
(When I do my prayers.)

How can I live daily with a greater consciousness of God abiding with me throughout my day?

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIOUSNESS

- How am I drawn to God: a friend, an event, a book, the beauty of nature?
- Have I learned anything about God and His ways: in ordinary occasions, spare moments?
- Have I met Him in: fears, joys, work, misunderstandings, weariness, suffering?
- Has His Word come alive in: prayer, small group, scriptures, liturgy?
- Do I bring Christ to my community? Am I open to others sharing Christ with me?
- Have I been a sign of God's presence and love to the people I meet daily?
- Did I go out to: the lonely, the sorrowful, the discouraged, the needy?
- Have I been generous with my time? My talents?
- Have I engaged in fellowship at Church, in my home, at work and social gatherings?
- Am I supportive of God's work in my own locality, my country, in other nations of the world, in the Church at large?
- Have I had a keener sense of being loved, of dependence on Him, of sinfulness, of desire to give back what I have received?
- How do I respond to God's love for me?
- Have I given serious prayer and thought to my purpose on Earth, to why God created me?
- Have I tried to make my work, my environment, a part of my prayer?
- Have I tried to maintain control of life's circumstances, or am I able to surrender the trials and temptations in my life to God?
- Is there some part of my life still untouched by Jesus Christ and where He is inviting me to a change of heart?
