

# February 19, 2017 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

I received a lot of interest in Soren Kierkegaard's Theory from last Sunday's homily so I am outlining the 3 Stages here. You will see the response in each stage to Law, Sin, and Reconciliation. I find it to be a very helpful tool in understanding where an individual is coming from.

Soren Kierkegaard (1813-1855) was a Danish theologian and philosopher who concerned himself with the steps by which one becomes a true Christian. He said there is no such thing as "being Christian" -- only "becoming Christian." He identified 3 Stages of Moral Growth, sometimes referred to as "Stages of Life's Way."

# **Stages of Moral Growth**

	Law	Sin	Reconciliation
Stage 1	restriction to	violation of	distasteful
Aesthetic Stage	freedom	restriction	task
Stage 2	guide to	infidelity to	valuable
Ethical Stage	growth	growth	tool
Stage 3	invitation to	refusal to	celebration of reconciliation
Religious Stage	love	love	

## Stage 1 -- The Aesthetic Stage

This stage is self-centered. We view law in an impersonal way, as a restriction to our freedom. We view sin in an impersonal way, as a violation of a restriction. Sin is breaking a law and nothing more.

# Stage 2 -- The Ethical Stage

This stage is other-centered. We view law in a personal way, as a guide to our personal growth. We view sin in a personal way, as an infidelity to personal growth. Sin is living irresponsibly.

# Stage 3 -- The Religious Stage

We progress to this stage when we discover our personal relationship with God. Once we progress to this stage, we become personally and spiritually mature. We become happily attached to Jesus -- The Vine and the Branches.

We view law (moral teaching) in an interpersonal way, as an invitation to love God!

We also view sin (moral failure) in an interpersonal way. It is a refusal to love God. It is saying no to God.

# Fr. Gerry,

I write with some hesitation, not only as a first timer, but also on the subject matter which is usually fraught with misunderstanding. But inasmuch as you request open dialogue, I share two thoughts on giving.

First, I theorize that money follows mission. Granted, folks give to their churches for various reasons, such as obedience to Holy Scripture, e.g., returning to the storehouse (Mal. 3:10). But, money flows readily from wallets when mission-mindedness leads. For me, giving to preserve and promote a mission is empowering and a natural outflow of being connected within the Kingdom. Hence, I commend your philosophy of moving from maintenance to mission.

Second, and more intuitively, am I listening to God? What is He saying? What should I hear? What is He showing me? What should I see? Am I attuned to Holy Spirit's urgings? Am I hearing and seeing what He is presenting me? If the answer is yes, or even close to yes, then I dare not follow God's leading. And, when I follow, God provides. Abundantly. Exceeding my expectations. My giving then is as natural and affirming as falling asleep after a good day's work.

As a friend has challenged me to think, "God always pays for what He orders".
