Deacon John McGregor and I had the opportunity to spend two days with our fellow priests, deacons, and lay ecclesial ministers at the Duncan Gray Retreat Center in Canton, MS, along with our bishop and many of our Diocesan Chancery staff Monday through Wednesday of last week.

The purpose of the gathering was to share the Diocesan Vision/Plan as we move forward. The development of this plan has been in place for the past two years, and this was another significant step in the process — unfolding the plan for the leaders of parishes.

In March and April, there will be nine meetings in various parishes/center around the Diocese inviting parishioners from all parishes to be present at one of those sessions. A list of host parishes is on the Diocesan website as well as our parish website.

I encourage you to consider participating in the local one to be held at the St. Dominic Annex on Sunday, March 19th @ 6 pm. I think it is a great opportunity for some of our St. Paul family to participate and be engaged in the promulgation of the Diocesan plan.

The Diocesan Plan is the result of a great deal of work, and the engagement of a very broad spectrum of people throughout our Diocese. There were Listening Sessions held all around the Diocese for priests and parishioners. Approximately 1,100 people attended those sessions which was a very good sampling of our Diocese. A committee of 20 people worked with representatives of the Catholic Leadership Institute to assimilate all of the information gleaned from those listening sessions.

This process ultimately led to the identification of the following three priorities for the Diocese. They are not in a specific order, but all three constitute the objectives of the Diocese in terms of the Vision/Mission.

Create inviting and reconciling communities
Facilitate life-long formation of intentional disciples
Proclaim Jesus Christ and our Catholic Faith

It is gratifying, indeed, to realize that we have been working on all three of those objectives for sometime here at St. Paul. While we have accomplished some of the objectives in each category, it helps us to see how much more needs to be accomplished both in our own parish and throughout the Diocese.

We have been working on our own Parish vision and plan for the past three years, and as you may know, an integral part of our plan is inscribed on the wall outside the double doors to the sanctuary — **Maintenance to Mission** — moving our Parish from a maintenance experience to being a parish of missionary disciples.
