Fr. Gerry, In response to your question, I see only one rule: attentiveness. We should come to worship with the explicit purpose of being attentive to the words-the words of Holy Scripture, the words of the prayers, the words of the priest, and the words of the songs. If we attend to the words with a heart open to the wisdom He is offering, the guidance He is providing, and the mercy He is extending, we will be moved. Such attentiveness will block out or minimize the distractions of crying children, chatting friends, and casual clothing; such attentiveness will draw us closer to our Lord, making our experience very personal. It will allow the experience of the Eucharist to be all it is meant to be.

### Fr. Gerry,

You asked us to write some "Rules of Engagement" and I was intrigued. I have given it some thought and here is a little piece of my Faith experience. I've been a rule follower all my life. For my childhood years, college and many years of my adult life, I did everything the way I was taught--to the letter. I genuflected every time I entered a pew. I always prayed on my knees, eyes closed, head bowed and in complete silence. I said all the prayers I had memorized from childhood. I attended Mass every Sunday, singing, praying, responding, and receiving Christ in the Eucharist. I went to Confession monthly and volunteered regularly. Those were the rules. Church for me was not about engagement. I did not go to church to meet new people. I did not go to listen to God or to encounter Christ in a personal way.

In recent years, I have realized that my Faith and the way I worship are less about the rules and more about relationship. Now, my favorite way to pray is seated, head up, mind cleared, and heart open to hear, feel, listen, and know God intimately as Father, Son & Spirit. That does not necessarily follow the old rules as I understood them.

People have come and gone from my life. Some I miss greatly, others not so much. But, I see the value in engagement with others at Mass. To engage means to become involved with another. When I am folded inside of myself and I go to Mass without engaging and interacting with someone else, I leave feeling pretty much the same way I entered-- sad and lonely. But, when I make eye contact with someone else, exchange a smile, a hug, a hello, it makes all the difference in the world. It makes a difference for me and for the other person. It is being Christ-like. He is part of each and every person. Engaging with the persons sitting near me is part of the Mass experience. Make eye contact. Exchange a smile. Give a hug and a hello!

We all have influence on those around us, whether we mean to or not. So, when I am anywhere (but especially when I am at Church) I can spread joy or I can spread sadness, I can spread kindness or bitterness, excitement or boredom, reverence or disregard, positivity or negativity.....and others can do the same for me!
