"Father, this just doesn't sound very Catholic?"

Deacon John reflected last week on our parish's quest to move from **Maintenance to Mission**. He reflected on the Transfiguration Experience on Mount Tabor and the Holy Father's words on the New Evangelization in *Evangelii Gadium* (Joy of the Gospel). "Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: We no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries" but rather that we are "**Missionary Disciples**."

Obviously, if we accept the Holy Father's invitation to be Missionary Disciples, then the first questions that arise are:

What is a Missionary Disciple? What do they do? How do they live? How do they witness?

A good place to start would naturally be our Holy Father Francis, himself. He is not just *talking* about Missionary Disciples --- he is *showing* us what it looks like to be one! At 80 years of age, he is leading powerfully and setting a profound example of what it means to "be in Jesus Christ."

The Lineamenta document produced in preparation for the 2011 Pope Benedict visit with the bishops of the Philippines defines the goal of Evangelization as the "realization of a personal encounter with Jesus Christ in the Spirit, thereby leading to an experiencing of His Father and our Father." (#11) Evangelization is always Trinitarian: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Most commonly it is experienced as bringing people to Jesus Christ, having first experienced Him through the power of His Holy Spirit, then helping all truly know the Father! Subsequently, in Benedict's meeting with the bishops, he said to them, "Your great task in Evangelization is therefore to propose a personal relationship with Christ as key to complete fulfillment."

On April 11, 2014, Pope Francis tweeted, "Only trust in God can transform doubts into certainty, evil into good, night into radiant dawn."

Being a **Missionary Disciple** is not about knowing, it is about having a personal relationship with Him -- That is what ChristLife is all about! -- That is what our lives are about! --

Yet, one of the great obstacles (one of <u>many</u> that we need to identify openly and honestly as we move from **Maintenance to Mission**) is the number of people who continue saying:

Father, this just doesn't sound very Catholic.
