
October 2, 2016 Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Prior to the Second Vatican Council, there was a **PERCEPTION** that we didn't need the help of the congregation except members to take up the collection and someone to do the Sacristy duties. That was pretty true! The motto or model was to limit the number of people involved or engaged. The altar rails seemed to serve as a declaration — this far, and no farther!

Thank God for the Second Vatican Council and its emphasis on the Role of the Laity in the Church! We began, slowly I might say, to move from the adage "as few as possible doing all" to "more people doing less." We now encourage all people to be active and engaged in the Communal Celebration! The Eucharist is no longer my private devotion, but rather a celebration of the communal faith of the gathered assembly. We have made great progress, but much more remains to be done.

It is the essence of what Saint Paul says: "Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ." 1Corinthians 12:12

We are one body, but not all have the same gifts. One may have the gift of speaking or reading well, another the gift of administering well, another the gift of welcoming, another the gift of serving others. But all gifts serve the Body!

The sign of a healthy Church is identifying which gifts are most suitable in which places, with which individual. Let us do that well!
