INTENTIONAL Discipleship



INTENTION was the first word we explored in our new "Word of the Month" series we began last January. At that time, we reflected on the INTENTIONALity of the Magi as they made their journey to see the Newborn King. We applied that to our own lives asking, How many circumstances/situations in my life would be much clearer if my INTENTIONS were clearer?

As we continue our focus on moving from Maintenance to Mission ... As we begin a new school-year As we celebrate Labor Day ... As we go back to work after the summer vacations we will take the month of September to reflect on our INTENTION. What did the vacations provide me that will help throughout this coming year? What new goals do I have for school this year? What new goals do I have for my family? How do I plan to advance myself?

We will also move a little farther outside ourselves and reflect on INTENTIONS for our parish. What are my goals as a member of St. Paul within our parish? How do I represent St. Paul Catholic Church outside the parish activities?

Sherry Weddell, co-director of the Catherine of Siena Institute, works daily to assist Catholic parishes in developing lay apostles for their mission in the world. In her book, *Forming Intentional Disciples,* Weddell encourages each of us to closely look at our INTENTION in living as a follower of Christ:

"No matter how many institutions we sustain or how much activity goes on in our parish or diocese, if new INTENTIONAL disciples are not regularly emerging in our midst, our ministry is not bearing its most essential fruit." She addresses our vocation as a member of the assembly. Each of us is called to a vocation, "a supernatural mystery that emerges from a sustained encounter with Christ.....A vocation builds on our natural qualities but carries us far beyond what we would imagine."

How do I INTENTIONALLY work to create an environment for myself and those in my midst that grows our faith and discipleship? This is why we are offering Religious Education for all ages, RCIA, Adult Bible Study Groups, Lectio Divina Groups, Eucharistic Adoration, and the ChristLife Sessions. These opportunities help us encounter Him and follow Him.

This Sunday's Gospel of Luke continues Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. Jesus says, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:26-27) Jesus is asking us to love Him so strongly that we are willing to give up love of family, if called to do so. Do I love my family out of loving Him and knowing He loves me? Jesus is asking us to consider our INTENTION. Is He the priority of my life, or do I squeeze Him in between the other priorities of my life? Being a disciple of Christ can be very demanding. How can I make the demands of my family, my life, fit into the demands of being His disciple? What is my INTENTION as I carry my cross and follow Him?
