SOMEBODY'S KNOCKING — WHO'S ANSWERING?

The family, often described as the domestic church, is called to proclaim, celebrate, and live the Gospel as a unit, just as each of us are also called as individuals. The strength of the Church is only going to be as strong as the combined membership of the domestic churches that make up her membership. Parents are entrusted with a special role and responsibility in forming their children in Faith.

Parents are the Primary teachers of their children in the ways of faith! The Church is a secondary teacher that exists to support the parents in their work. The Church can never supplant the parental role in the raising up of their child in the ways of faith. This is a God-Given role, an integral part of the acceptance of the invitation from God to be Co-Creator with Him in bringing a new child into the world. My "yes" to procreation in communion with God is my "yes" also to all of the attendant responsibilities.

Unfortunately, this does not always work! Consequently, the Church is faced with a major dilemma. Do we as Church try to take on the total responsibility for the child's faith formation? Many would say yes, perhaps based on the adage "half a loaf is better than no bread" others would clearly say no, perhaps based on the adage "A responsibility that is entrusted specifically to one cannot adequately be carried out by another."

Sadly, the Church has often attempted to take on the parental role, and while it has been beneficial in some circumstances and situations, for the most part it really hasn't worked — and that really should not be surprising to us — because the primary focus in the Catholic Church is not knowledge, and it is not the number of classes or grades I have been through. It is about bringing individuals to a personal, loving relationship with my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Having the quality of people and the process to bring that about is extremely important to us here at St. Paul. Accordingly, we will no longer enroll students for just one year of Sacramental preparation (example: just for First Communion, or Confirmation).

This weekend, we celebrate Catechetical Sunday and we acknowledge our wonderful Catechists. What a generous and devoted group of individuals offering themselves in service of our children and youth! To put it as succinctly as we possibly can, we would not exist as a parish without the commitment of these generous people. I know some might say that is ridiculous but it is true! Without these generous volunteers we would be unable to carry out a fundamental function of being a Community of Faith — to instruct people (esp. children and youth) in the ways of our faith. As we pray a blessing over our Catechists at each of the Masses this weekend, I invite you to be aware of the extraordinary nature of their work. I encourage you to be truly grateful for their ministry.

Additionally, I would like to invite many more of you to join them in this excellent Ministry — perhaps the greatest Ministry of all — raising up our Young, so that the Church may continue to flourish after us. We are not seeking professionals or theology experts, we are simply seek people who love the Lord.

Each year about this time, we always make a pitch for more teachers, more assistants, more helpers, more guides — the response has always been disappointing. **Maybe this is the year that things will change, and we will have more people to evangelize our upcoming generations.** Your assistance would be beneficial to us in myriad ways — whether you can help all the time, some of the time, seasonally, or just periodically — we can celebrate your commitment. Please join us in this great Ministry of raising up the next generation.
