Naturally, one of the very sad consequences of those roles not being taken care of responsibly or adequately is that some children grow up as victims of Spiritual Neglect!

A friend shared a story of when her eldest child started kindergarten, he was asked to fill out a sheet of "Mom's Favorite Things" for a Mother's Day gift. Her son listed "laundry" as her favorite thing to do. Wow! There was a great deal of laundry to do, and she realized that must be what he saw her doing most of the time. So, she started being more deliberate in her schedule of chores and necessary, but mundane things. She planned her day as if her children were watching every move to see what they themselves should be doing. She began to realize the importance of her witness to them, and this changed her attitude/perspective about Eucharist and matters of Faith.

Let your child see how important Faith is in your life. Let them see you pray. Let them see you serve in a Ministry, and volunteer in their Religious Ed class that they may see you learning and growing with them. Then, you can have great discussions about Faith/God at home, because you were both present. As they grow into the teen years, some of our youth have followed friends to social and spiritual programs in other denominations. We have great activities fulfilling several areas including Instruction, Friendship, Spirituality, and Service. We have a great deal to offer as well. If you, as a parent, are more involved, you can have input into the programs, you will be better aware of all we have going on, and you can help your children be more involved. The objective we have in mind at St. Paul is Whole Family Catechesis!

We do have an increase in the number of children enrolled in our Religious Ed programs, and that is great! The mission of these classes is to help the children and youth experience the love of God. We want them to grow closer to God and carry His Word and Love with them every time they leave St. Paul Church. We are shifting our focus to better prepare the children for First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation so those are now a two-year Sacramental preparation program. They are so important in our understanding of the Catholic Faith and the development of our intimate relationship with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
