# Listen.....He's calling you. How will you respond?

Our Parish has been committed to the ChristLife Process for five years, now. We began this Process in an effort to move us all from Maintenance to Mission. It is still written on the wall to remind us as we leave Mass each week. We have said it many times lately—
Religious people have preferences, Missionary people have stories.

What is our story? Who are we as the Community of St. Paul? Why are we here? What is God's Purpose in our lives, individually and collectively?

We have had hundreds of people complete one or all of the Three-Part Series — Discovering Christ, Following Christ, and Sharing Christ — this is a valuable process to grow our community in the Church's essential mission of evangelizing and making missionary disciples. We have had nearly 500 people complete Discovering Christ, and 281 completed Following Christ. We hope the remaining 200+ will join us for our next offering of Following Christ, beginning the week after Easter. The Holy Spirit is the primary one asking and encouraging you to complete the ChristLife experience. The Lord speaks to us in very different ways in each of the phases of ChristLife.

ChristLife is an answer to our call to evangelization — The Church teaches that before discipleship or catechesis can be effective, people must hear the Gospel and make a personal response to it. We must first know Him in order to follow Him and share Him. The invitation to follow Christ is based on God's initiative—His love for us, the forgiveness of sins, and the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Grace of God empowers us to live.

What is our response? What effort do we make to mature in following His plan? (continued on next page)

Dave Nodar and the ChristLife staff explain the process this way.

"If you choose to excel in a sport, playing a musical instrument, or in a profession, you have to find a competent coach/teacher who can train you in the proper techniques. You must then establish the discipline of regular practice to become proficient in the area where you want to excel.

Now think about this: You and I have the chance to learn from the most intelligent, wise, loving, perfect Teacher who ever lived. And we have the chance to become His student, His disciple! We can be conformed to Jesus in every way: how we relate to God the Father, how we view the world, how we think, how we conduct ourselves, how we relate to others, and how we use our time, gifting, and resources. By His grace and our effort, we can learn to live a joyful life surrendering more and more over the years to the Lordship of Jesus.

The focus in this second part of the ChristLife process of evangelization, that began in Discovering Christ, is continuing conversion of life through a seven-week journey of prayer, teaching and relationships that support the participants' decision to become a disciple of Christ and to begin to apply the Lord's teaching to every area of life. Its purpose is practical guidance, not academic teaching, on growing in relationship with Jesus Christ. In this stage of discipleship, some of the most formative means of helping a person grow in union with God are the experiences of personal and group prayer, practical teaching with opportunity for small group discussion and relationships that support the development of a Catholic lifestyle, world view and mission. While the teachings tell us "what" to do, the friendships built in the small groups provide the relational support to genuinely incarnate these teachings in our lives."

We will be using new, updated videos for Following Christ. This is our first time to offer them, and we are excited! The content is the same, but they are presented in a new, more engaging manner. Anyone who has completed Discovering Christ, is encouraged and invited to register for Following Christ. If you have already completed Following Christ and would like to experience the new videos, we welcome you to the experience as well. You may even consider being a Table Host or Co-Host.

Our Intercessory Prayer Team, which was the first element in place to bring ChristLife to our Parish, has been praying faithfully for ChristLife all these years. They pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on our parish, and for special guidance of the Holy Spirit for our parish and all people involved in ChristLife. Many have answered. There are more waiting to respond.
