August 11/12, 2018 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

COVENANTS

"TAKE THIS ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT, FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS MEMORY IN MEMORY OF ME." (EUCHARISTIC PRAYER I).

The First Reading from this past Thursday was from the Book of Jeremiah. In Chapter 31, God promises the house of Judah that He will establish a new covenant with them that will be unlike the covenants God made with their fathers. In this new covenant, God promises that He will write the law on their heart, that He will forgive their evildoing, and that He will remember their sins no more.

The Gospel Readings from the last two Sundays have been from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. I'm sure many of you recognize the superabundant Eucharistic imagery in St. John's account of the Feeding of the Multitude, the Bread of Life Discourse, and in the coming weeks, Jesus' proclamation that the Bread of Life is His Body and Blood, a fact which causes many of His disciples to abandon Him. Together, all of these Readings invite deeper reflection on just what is the nature of this New and Everlasting Covenant that is our inheritance.



In my study of this, I derive the following unique aspects of the New Covenant:

- 1. God has proclaimed this covenant as everlasting. God made many covenants with Israel throughout Sacred Scripture, but the nature of those covenants always required that the people of Israel obey God's law. Anyone who is even remotely familiar with Scripture will recognize that human beings are miserable at keeping God's law. God had to continually make new covenants with Israel because of their infidelity.
- 2. God will write the law in their hearts. The old covenants of the law were written on stone tablets or papyrus scrolls, and as suggested above, these covenants were no more durable than the material they were written on. But God has now written this New Covenant on people's hearts. The only law Jesus gave us was the Law of Love, which can only be written on the heart by God.
- 3. It is guaranteed by the blood of Christ. The old covenants were sealed with the blood of animals, which did not withstand the test of time. It is interesting that the covenant God enters into is not a suzerain or vassal covenant in which God proclaims his superiority over His vassal servants. Rather it is a kinship covenant in which God adopts us as His children, His very special possession (See Romans 8).
- 4. The nature of the covenant is forgiveness. How do you break a covenant in which the central tenant is forgiveness for breaking the covenant? In the past, the covenants with Israel were usually about land, possessions, protection from their enemies, or the law. The New and Everlasting covenant, guaranteed by God's own word, written on our hearts, guaranteed by Jesus' own blood is an unbreakable covenant. It is a covenant of forgiveness. How do you break a covenant of forgiveness?
