Reading With New Perspective

Jesus said to His disciples: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" (Luke 12:49) "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." (Luke 12:51) — Wait. What? This doesn't sound like our loving, merciful Savior....until we read it with a different perspective!!!

In both Jewish and Christian traditions, a pillar of fire symbolized the Divine Presence. As a biblical image, fire symbolizes purification and the Holy Spirit. Jesus is speaking of His passing from death to life setting the fire blazing. That fire will purify our hearts, separate believers and non-believers, and destroy sin.

It's amazing how those words feel different on our tongues with this new perspective! All situations have at least two viewpoints — or rather, three — Yours, Mine, and the Truth. The two passages below show how we can be freed from needless anxiety and pain when we consider things in a different light.

I asked.....I received (author unknown)

- I asked God for strength that I might achieve.... I was made weak that I might learn humility.
- I asked for health that I might do greater things.... I was given infirmity that I might do better things.
- I asked for riches that I might be happy.... I was given poverty that I might be wise.
- I asked for power that I might be praised.... I was given weakness that I might feel I need God.
- I asked for an abundance of things to enjoy life.... I was given life that I might enjoy all things.

I got nothing that I asked for, but everything I hoped for. Almost despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered and I was most richly blessed!
