





Our mission is to invite everyone into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

You have voted! Now there is more for you to do!

Thank you all for your votes and input regarding the future of our parish building. Based on your responses indicated on the Decision Cards, our vision is now to build a new church. A total of 547 votes were cast with 80% of those voting to build a new church.

Building committee members recently met with a local general contractor who has built several area churches, and we feel a safe cost estimate of a new church is around \$6.5 million. We have \$2 million available in savings, and we can comfortably borrow \$1.5 million based on our current income. This means we will need approximately \$3 million in pledges to proceed. **So, our original goal remains the same.....we need \$3 million in pledges to complete our project**.

The Capital Campaign pledges we received last summer total \$2.1 million, therefore **we need to raise at least an additional \$1 million**. In order to meet this goal, we will <u>all</u> have to renew our pledges. We have 300 pledges currently on file. As you recommit the pledge that you made last summer, we ask you to consider increasing your pledge. Nearly 200 of our contributing families have not yet made a pledge. We need your financial support to build a new church, and we ask you to prayerfully consider making a pledge.

If we reach our \$3 million pledge goal, we will make some immediate needed repairs to our existing building, and move forward with planning the new construction. The vision and plans for repurposing our current sanctuary will be developed much later in this process.

If we do not meet the \$3 million pledge goal, plans for building a new church will be halted. Please prayerfully consider this. *Where is the Lord leading our parish? What is He calling us to do now?*

New pledge cards will be handed out the first weekend of January. We need to receive a card from each family — whether you already have a pledge on file, are making a new pledge, or choose not to pledge. We need a response from every family. This is the only way to know if building a new church is financially feasible.
