Decision Cards Update

During the weekend Masses on November 9th & 10th and November 16th & 17th, our parishioners were invited to fill out a Decision Card and vote for Option 1 or Option 2, and to provide additional information in regard to disposition of pledges. This was done in order to gauge the new direction for our parish building plans.

In order to be good stewards of our parish money, the Building Committee had decided that the current proposed Renovation Plan was no longer a feasible option. We determined that there are two viable options: 1) build a new church using all our available resources, and 2) focus on the necessary repairs for our existing church. We had a clear vision that all of our people would be provided an opportunity to register their choice for Option 1 or 2.

The preliminary results were provided in the November 17th bulletin with a further invitation for those who had not responded to do so. Since that time, an additional 103 parishioners have responded.

Of these 528 responses, here are the results:

- 423 parishioners voted in support of building a new church.
 (12 of these votes were from youth)
- 105 parishioners voted to not support building a new church.

To date, the majority of our parishioners believe God is leading our parish to build a new church. Our goal is to complete the voting by December 8th. If any parishioner has not yet rendered their decision, please do so.

Should the final decision be to build a new church, then the hard work will begin in earnest. At that point, it will be necessary for us to assess the cost and determine if parishioners are willing and able to provide the financial support. Until we establish that we have the means and support, no work will be done on the design, timeline, or construction process.

Your prayers, support, and understanding are very much appreciated during this difficult process. Please continue to pray for the Lord's guidance and providential care of our parish.
