
The Parish Office will be closed: Wednesday, Dec 20 @ noon through Tuesday, Jan 1

Fr. Hurley,

I've been thinking a lot about my image of God. As the holiday season is upon us, I have been running around trying to get everything ready, to make things perfect. As I was cleaning, I came across my notes from a previous discussion (is the Church failing) and remember the two words I got from that: fail and witness; we are failing to witness. That then brought me to the things I learned going through Christ Life. As I just completed the last session, Sharing Christ, witnessing was fresh on my mind. That lead to my image of God.

Sometimes I feel like we have to be perfect to come to know Christ and have a relationship with him. How can we know God if we don't know his word and teachings? How can we expect to have that personal, deep relationship if we are lost or broken? And with out those, how in the world are we to witness? My life has been a roller coaster, with highs and lows, and twists and turns. But I always knew something was missing.

As my daughter got older, I felt the need to get her back to church. While she did things with my sisters church and she knew who God was, I knew I had to build a better foundation for her. This world can be a scary place. So as I pushed her to go to church and Sunday school, the most wonderful thing happened. The youth group expanded to include the 7th and 8th graders. We both joined. And I slowly begin to understand what was missing, God. I realized I didn't have to be perfect. God said all are welcome and to come as you are.

A few years in, my hunger for God began to grow out of my control. I got more active, began to read more, and joined in with small groups and church discussions. I don't have to be perfect. I just have to keep going and trust that God will be with me always. So I realized that image I had of God, (He won't love me in my sin), was the exact opposite of who God is. He loves us with our sins and wants us to draw closer. He uses all we have in our Redemption. He gives us strength to face whatever comes our way. He doesn't want us to wait to be perfect. He wants us now and always. And even though the advent season is half way over, we don't have to wait for Lent to continue that deep reflection of our knowledge, faith, and relationship.

It's an ongoing process, something I have realized more and more as I take on new studies. We should constantly be nurturing that relationship. I may not be perfect, but I am ready and willing to walk with Christ by my side.
