December 30, 2018 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Dear Father Gerry,

As I reflected on the questions, "who is God" and do I have a relationship with Him, I can say without a doubt that Jesus is my Savior, and the Holy Spirit, (the Spirit of the risen Christ) is in my heart, and is always with me! BUT there has always been a disconnect from God the father for me!! Although I always pray to God the father in the name of Jesus, there was no real relationship as with Jesus and the Holy Spirit!

Let me explain. I was raised in a home with an earthly father who was an alcoholic. I never felt that he loved me, and he was never there for me. He was very physically abusive to my mother which made me hate him! So, I grew up with a disconnect to and fear of my earthly father. My mother, however, was the other side of the coin. She loved and acted as a buffer between my daddy and me.

But thanks be unto God, my story did not end in loneliness, fear and distrust. At the age of 12, a friend told me about JESUS; I invited him to come into my heart, and I knew I was saved. I made a public profession of faith and was baptized at Pearson Baptist Church in Pearl. Finally, I had some joy in my life.

Fast forward to my junior college years, and meeting the love of my life, Tommy Autrey. His passion was coaching baseball and football. We got married on November 1, 1963. Together, we made the decision to join the Catholic Church......which was the best decision we ever made. Then Father Michael O'Brien came into our lives. We were the first candidates to which he gave instructions. I must admit, however, I sometimes questioned if he was Christian since I was taught to accept the Bible literally! At my first confession after joining church, I forgave my father for all he had done to us. At that time we had only one son, Thomas (Trae). Andrew (Andy) was born 13 years later after Tommy changed his profession from coaching to insurance executive.

It was during the early years after Andrew's birth that God began to move in our lives in a powerful way. Father Richard Summers was our priest at St Therese Catholic church in south Jackson. We heard about charismatic prayer meetings at the Carmelite Monastery and I was so excited to attend. We received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit after finishing the Life in the Spirit seminar....what a gift!!! I have never been the same. God blessed me with His Grace, peace and joy.

Tommy retired in 1995 while we were living in Texas after a serious illness and surgery. We moved back to Brandon, Mississippi, and I joined St Paul Catholic Church. Father Hurley was the third priest we had after I joined and thank God he brought ChristLife to our parish. I was so humbled when I got a call from Cecilia to be part of the Intercessory Prayer Team. There were seven of us on the team at that time (seven is a perfect number in Hebrew numerology). Our mission was/is to pray for the success of ChristLife. We were formed 9 months before the first session was held.

I volunteered to be a facilitator, but did not think I would get too much out of it since I had already received the baptism in the Holy Spirit. How PRIDEFUL was that and how WRONG I was!

After attending one of the sessions, The Holy Spirit woke me at 3 in the morning and I felt compelled to go into the den to pray. As I prayed, God revealed to me that my life's PURPOSE was Intercessory prayer. Not only was I to pray as long as I am on this earth, but that I will continue to pray when I go to heaven!!! The joy flooded my soul and filled me to overflowing with the love of Jesus. But, I still had the inner struggle of how I could love God, the Father as I loved Jesus AND to allow Him to love me.

Thank you Jesus that I had a breakthrough at one of the training sessions. We watched a video that focused on God the father. I shared my problem with one of my table mates. She had the same problem and began to share her experiences of how God healed her of that hurt. There was now a "crack "into a door in my heart that had been off limits to the love of the Father. This was the beginning of my acceptance that God is my loving father, and the beginning of my journey with God the Father.

Am I where I want to be??? NO, cause I will always be a work in progress. Romans 8:28 tells us, "All things work together for the good of those that love the Lord and are called according to His Purpose". God used a bad situation in my life to transform me by His Amazing Grace. And now I know in my heart that GOD the Father loves me, and He will never leave me nor forsake me. Amen
