## Greetings Parishioners, from your St. Paul Small Group Ministry Team!

It is hard to believe that almost one year has passed since we kicked off our parishwide study, What on Earth Am I Here For? by Rick Warren. It has been a year of tremendous growth and blessings for our Small Group Ministry here at St. Paul.

Father Gerry and the Senior Leadership Team have been hard at work ensuring that all of the ministries in our Parish are aligned with our Mission to Live as the Body of Christ inviting everyone into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. We are all called to carry out the Great Commandment, to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength; and to "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Jesus left us, His followers, with the Great Commission, to "Go and make disciples of all nations." We are proud to say that our St. Paul Small Groups have been busy doing just that! Our Parish family is growing mature, intentional disciples!

We currently have almost 30 active small groups meeting regularly in homes. Each group is unique. Some meet weekly, some bi-weekly, some have a dedicated host home while others rotate homes; some serve meals while some share snacks.

Many groups have members who are their neighbors, some who are not members here at St. Paul, and some who are from other denominations. Each Small Group operates independently, with the support of our Small Group Ministry Team. We provide curriculum from our ever-growing library of group studies, and on-going guidance on addressing issues that may arise in groups.

This weekend, we invite everyone to consider joining a Small Group, and we are here to answer any questions you may have. Registration is also open on our website.

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This means that, not only do they meet for our two annual parish-wide studies, they also stay available to each other through fellowship, worship, and mission work — both within our parish, and outside the walls of St. Paul in our community.

Our Small Groups are:

- A center for discipleship
- A launch pad for evangelism
- A setting for worship and relationships
  - An opportunity to offer support, encouragement, healing
    - A source of health and growth
  - A safe environment for vulnerability
    - The very heartbeat of our Church

**OPPORTUNITY** — If you are not already a member of a group, we urge you to consider hosting a group in your home, or joining an existing group. Our hosts are not "teachers." They are people who are answering God's call and opening their homes to friends old and new for prayer, worship, and fellowship outside of Mass. We invite you to pray about this — when the Holy Spirit prompts you with a desire, the Lord will provide a way. If you have 2 or 3 interested friends, you can be a host. It is that simple! We will connect everyone who is seeking a group with groups who have room for more members. Most groups have about 8-10 members, making it easier to accommodate and to give more opportunity for sharing.

**RETREAT** — The Small Group Ministry Team will be providing a Retreat Day for our hosts and co-hosts on Sunday, February 10, in the Family Life Center, beginning at 2:00pm and ending with a supper and social time. Please note, this Retreat is open to our current hosts and co-hosts, as well as anyone interested in becoming a host!

**LENTEN STUDY** — We are excited to announce our 2019 Lenten Small Group Study of the book, *Respectable Sins, Confronting the Sins We Tolerate*, by Jerry Bridges. This study will take a deeper look at unthankfulness, frustration, pride, judgmentalism, and sins of the tongue — to name a few! We will begin the week of February 24. The Church will order the books for all groups who wish to participate, so be sure to let us know you want to join us in this intriguing Lenten Study!
