Divine Renovation is Intentional

Have you ever felt a thrill about packing to go to a destination, a place you had never been before? This is how I felt while preparing to go to Halifax, Nova Scotia for the Divine Renovation Conference; the thrill of seeing another culture, learning new things, meeting new friends, and eating new foods. We were headed to St. Benedict Parish, the leader of Divine Renovation. They are successfully implementing the teachings professed in the book written by their pastor, Fr. James Mallon.

I am aware that our parish is on our way to being a community of intentional disciples, but being at St. Benedict made me realize how extensive that journey is. There is much more opportunity ahead of us in terms of growth. We arrived a day early to attend Sunday Mass and see for ourselves how Divine Renovation had been implemented in Fr. Mallon's parish. From the moment we drove onto the property of St. Benedict, we could tell we were in for an exciting experience! There were so many volunteers directing traffic and talking to the people in the parking lot. The Divine Renovation Team stood outside the entrance to greet all participants at the doors. Every day, at least 12-15 hospitality hosts formed a line inside the entryway to sincerely welcome us to their church, and let us know that they had been praying for us intentionally and individually by name.

This particular Sunday at St. Benedict was "name tag Sunday" and everyone, even the priests, wore a name tag. Hospitality hosts were at every corner to answer questions, direct us to food, conversational areas, bathrooms, and the sanctuary. The welcome we received set the tone for Mass, and as soon as it began we were "hooked on the feeling." From that first moment, we could feel the Holy Spirit alive and in our presence through the whole-hearted singing and responses from all gathered there. Mass at St. Benedict was the most Spirit-filled Liturgy I have ever experienced! We were instructed to turn to someone we did not know, introduce ourselves, and pray for that person throughout Mass. Hospitality and stewardship are not things they practice only once a week, it is a way of life lived every day!

At the closing Mass, Fr. Mallon asked all the volunteers to step forward to the sanctuary so that the attendees could express appreciation to them. As we watched this procession of over 300 joy-filled "intentional disciples" step forward, I knew with certainty that there are greater things in store for our parish as we become "intentional" in inviting the Holy Spirit to fill us and lead us, as has been the case at St. Benedict!

The whole experience confirmed my faith that hospitality is the key to building successful ministries and is the basis for the formation of "intentional disciples." In the service of God and neighbor, we must first recognize the gifts/talents bestowed on each of us for the benefit of all. As we offer ourselves in service to the Father we become joy-filled "intentional disciples."
