DIVINE RENOVATION

Last week, I provided an account of our involvement with Divine Renovation and our recent trip to Nova Scotia. We were able to see all of that work and the renovation that is taking place at St. Benedict Parish, as well as many parishes that are connected with them throughout the world.

Parishes that were represented at this 2nd Annual Convocation were at various stages of growth and development. They were also at different stages of connectedness and relationship with the whole Divine Renovation Process. Nonetheless, all who were participating from every country far and near had the same one common theme — They were fired up about the idea of their parish being renewed and about the New Evangelization.



What is the New Evangelization, you may ask? I guess it is new in that we are taking a new look at what we are supposed to be, and what we are supposed to be doing in Church. Fifty-five years ago, the New Evangelization of that period began on October 11, 1963. The visionary Pope John XXIII convened the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council at St. Peters. John XXIII's vision was, "I want to throw open the windows of the Church so that we can see out, and the people can see in."

These words of John XXIII to the assembled leaders from the opening address capture his enthusiasm and his recognition of the movement of the Holy Spirit!

"As regards the immediate cause for this great event, which gathers you here together at our bidding, it is sufficient for us to put on record once more something which, though trifling in itself, made a deep impression on us personally. The decision to hold an ecumenical council came to us in the first instance in a sudden flash of inspiration. We communicated this decision, without elaboration, to the Sacred College of Cardinals on that memorable January 25, 1959, the feast of St. Paul's Conversion, in his patriarchal basilica in the Ostien Way. The response was immediate. It was as though some ray of supernatural light had entered the minds of all present: it was reflected in their faces; it shone from their eyes. At once the world was swept by a wave of enthusiasm, and men everywhere began to wait eagerly for the celebration of this Council.

"For three years the arduous work of preparation continued. It consisted in making a detailed and accurate analysis of the prevailing condition of the faith, the religious practice, and the vitality of the Christian, and particularly the Catholic, body.

"We are convinced that the time spent in preparing for this Ecumenical Council was in itself an initial token of grace, a gift from heaven."

It is with great sadness we must acknowledge that the great hopes and dreams of the visionary Saint John XXIII never even came close to its potential. The blame for its not coming to fruition remains firmly in the hands of the hierarchy and the clerical leaders of the Church.

This New Evangelization may get our attention to sufficiently move us to an awareness that at least we are in need of change. Profoundly. I am hopeful in what I see in Divine Renovation. I invite you to join me and our other parish members in exploring the experience — the Process.
