Dear Fr. Gerry,

Hope you all are enjoying Halifax and being filled with the Holy Spirit. We miss you all.

Here is a note on the school / hospital discussion:

"The Church, which is often described as a hospital, contains too many patients who fail to get well. The Church, often described as a school, contains too many pupils who fail to learn".

I have had a hard time relating to this quote but have spent much time thinking about it and enjoyed responses to it in the hospital / school Wednesday discussions. The thought that slowly came to mind is that the church seems to focus on the world to come and not much on the joy and peace that comes from seriously practicing our faith today *right here and now*.

I have learned in recent years that the more I attend daily and Sunday mass, truly listen and participate in our ministries, serve as a volunteer when asked, join in groups like the school / church dialogue, Christ Life, and our small groups my life is enriched. When I interact with my church family, I find that I am happier, more at peace and able to deal with suffering better than ever before. In other words, I get benefits from our hospital and our school *right here and right now.*

My two cents worth is that Catholic churches everywhere might be better hospitals and schools if we could get out the word that there are huge benefits to practicing a spiritual life *right here and now.* There are so many books on how mindfulness, exercise, diet, the power of positive thinking, how to get rich, yoga, the art of conversation, how to win friends and influence people, etc. etc. But we already have a powerful tool to get happiness and peace. Practicing, practicing, and practicing will help hone spiritual skills that give more peace and happiness in practical ways *right here and now.*

And certainly, we can still hope and dream of the pure joy believing that death is not the end but the new beginning of eternal joy, peace and belonging in the kingdom to come.
