# **September 23, 2018 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**











What is the Month's Mind you may ask? Well, it is a long-standing tradition and practice in the Irish Culture. I am not sure of any other places that celebrate the Month's Mind, but I do hear of clusters of Irish families in places such as England, Australia, and the U.S. who hold onto the practice.

The Month's Mind is an opportunity to gather and celebrate a memorial for a loved one who has died, sometime around a month after that person's burial. The practice is born out of the reality and awareness that quite often the time of the funeral is a period of shock and disorientation for the family. Many people on leaving the services pledge to the immediate family they will pray for and support them. Sometimes, friends & neighbors say, "If you need anything at all, just call me. I will be there for you!" It is not surprising that such a generous offer is rarely acted upon. The Month's Mind is a practice to bring that sort of support and invitation more into perspective, and to renew support of the immediate family. It is also a recognition that some of the shock may be wearing off, and the reality is setting in. This is a good time to gather anew to show support and love for the family. Since I cannot be with my family in Ireland for the Month's Mind, the staff is hosting one here with my St. Paul family. Please join us if you can! — Fr. Gerry



The St. Paul Women's Guild

This is a group of women who love the Lord, desire to serve the parish and community, and have fun together. ## History ~

The Women's Guild began as the Catholic Women's Association (CWA) in 1978, around the same time our Parish was established. The archives for the CWA outline their activities as cleaning the parish kitchen, caring for the altar linens, preparing weekly meals for the pastor and monthly meals for the YMCA Hospitality House, visiting the elderly, funding a nursery during Sunday Masses, sponsoring flowers for special celebrations, providing food and service for parish receptions, fund raising, Bible Study, and social activities. They purchased appliances for the parish kitchen, contributed money for a Nativity Scene, plant decanters for the altar, church pews, and a lending library.

This organization has evolved over the years in response to the needs of the parish and the women. Some of their activities and services have changed hands and even moved into separate parish ministries. Throughout their history, what has remained is the women's commitment to the parish. Reading the archives clearly reveals how active they have been in the life of the parish since its beginning. They have always had a great love for St. Paul Parish, the community and each other, which is an expression of their strong love for God. Many of the first officers and members are still present and active in the Women's Guild today!

## Today ~

**The Mission of the Women's Guild** today is to "build fellowship and community by encouraging lasting friendships among the women of the parish through spiritual, social and charitable events." Their means of accomplishing this mission is by 1) providing spiritual enrichment; 2) participating as a group in a social service activity; 3) developing deeper Christian fellowship; 4) sponsoring one fundraising activity per year 5) participating in Guild and parish activities through attendance, prayer and talents.

The Women's Guild does not require membership and they do not pay dues. Participation in the Guild is open to all women over the age of 18. They have elected officers and Committee Chairs. Any woman may attend any event or activity with no further obligation. Female parishioners, non-parishioner family members and friends are welcome. Various programs are offered from **September to May** each year. **Why not give it a try? You just may find a new life-long friend!** Friendships formed by a spiritual bond provide nourishment to women in companionship with other women. Their journey is unique in the way they offer each other encouragement, prayer, and emotional support.

Our Guild is currently under the leadership of President Cheryl Marsh who describes the group as women who love the Lord, desire to serve the parish and community, and have fun together. This year, there is **emphasis on women's spirituality with three special events** in the works:

## Fruits of Membership from the President ~

Cheryl Marsh has been a member for more than four years, and is currently serving her second year as President of the Women's Guild. Prior, she served two years as the chair of the Devotional Committee, and has been active in the Craft Sale, Bereavement Committee, Serving Food to the Opportunity Center, and serving at the RCIA and First Communion Receptions. She said, "Being new to this parish, the Women's Guild was a wonderful way for me to jump right in and get involved, meeting people and volunteering. The women were very welcoming, and I soon found a way to be more involved. Being new to a community and a parish, and transitioning from working full-time to retirement, it was lifesaving for me to find a place where I was welcomed and invited to be an active participant. This group has enhanced my faith experience because I met women who openly share their faith experience and their life journey. Women openly shared their stories — the ups and the downs — with an eye and ear to how God is working in their lives.

"In many ways, being active in Women's Guild is like being in a Small Group of Faith Sharing. We don't focus on formal teaching, but rather on lived experiences. I have learned so much from these women. Through it all, there is a love and laughter that is life-sustaining. I can get formal faith experiences from a variety of sources, I can only get the personal experience in relationship with others. It is different being in a group with all women than in a mixed group. Both are good, but the intimacy of faith-sharing with other women is just special and precious. I appreciate the Women's Guild for being there, and I pray I can pass on to the next newcomer what I, myself, have received."
